Reflected Meaning; Reflected meaning involves connections at the lexical level of language, where the meaning of one word is part of the response to another. Collocation Meaning; Collocation meaning often includes the associations that words acquire due to their meanings in context. Theme Meaning; The final category of meaning is thematic, which is conveyed through the speaker or writer's organization of the message in terms of order, focus, and emphasis. Speech in literature and language is a complex and multifaceted subject that has been studied and analyzed by experts in fields such as linguistics, literary theory, and rhetoric.
